
On Tuesday 27th April, an exhibition presenting The Beatles Hidden Gallery will be launched at the Menier Gallery, London.

## Please please me...

The man behind this distinctive collection of artwork is the celebrated cinematographer Paul Berriff, now widely recognised as one of the UK's leading documentary makers. Berriff has won a total of 17 film industry awards including a BAFTA and has also received a BAFTA nomination for his excellent work in television film cinematography. Starting his career as a press photographer at the Yorkshire Evening Post, he went on to become the youngest ever cameraman for BBC Television news at the age of 21. While practising his art before becoming a press photographer, he took it upon himself to request backstage access at local theatres - this tenacity led to him photographing many of the big names of the 60s including; The Rolling Stones, Roy Orbison, Marianne Faithfull, Cilla Black and, of course, The Beatles.

Berriff captured these stylish images without any special lighting equipment, instead using exposure techniques, inherent skill and his eye for a great photo opportunity. The images were taken on a Rolleiflex camera and a 35mm Nikon camera, which he still uses to this day.


